

Coalition Intention Plan






February 2009 Meeting, Summary

- The project managers who will conduct the implementation process will address the concerns you have listed and communicate with you to be certain they are reconciled.




NTXPCC - Current Coalition



- Those with documented metastasis




Screening – Initial Plan: How do We Start?

- Big Programs NOT an option for the Coalition at this time
- Screening Support

Survivors need to get more involved in supporting screenings

- Volunteering before and during events
- Assisting in publicizing events
- Will start with DadFest
- Coordinate Screenings
 - Needs Hospital Coordination
 - Dallas Area Hospitals: why not offer screenings throughout year, <u>like</u> Presbyterian at Valentine's, Baylor/P in June*, <u>Medical City</u> in August, Baylor/D* in September?
 - Stay away from June* (DadFest), September (PC Awareness month has smaller screening events)
- Challenge: Can We Increase Screening Numbers this Year?



Requirements

- PSA & DRE
- Some hospitals lowered minimum age requirements to 35 or 40


Numbers

- Around 880 men were screened (~10% increase from 2008)
- One hospital reported 8.8% abnormal results
- Did Coalition activity and screening controversy increase awareness?



Screening Support - Progress

- Increased number of volunteers at all events
- Increased publicity through website, some flyers

 - (Played screening video by Dr. Fulgham)
- Men's Health Day, Baylor/Plano
 - Presented Early Detection material (2 sessions)
- Cruisin' for a Cure
- Screening, Medical City/Dallas
 - Presented Early Detection material (2 sessions)
- Screening, Baylor/Dallas
- Texas Health HEB
 - Now November 21



Screening Support – 2010 Plan

- Screening Support
 - Can Early Detection material be presented at DadFest, Baylor/Dallas and at HEB?
 - Use survivors in screening lane (to answer questions)
 - Use flyers for DadFest/Cruisin' for a Cure, distributed by survivors?
- Coordinate Screenings
 - Medical City/Dallas and Baylor/Dallas screened at the same day this year
 - Is there a way to change that?
- Publicity
 - Baylor/Dallas, Medical City, Dallas and TH HEB listed by PCAW
 - TH Harris FW?
- Challenge: Can We Increase Screening Numbers in 2010?
 - Lower budgets for screening?



Screening – The Next Step #2?

New Screening Program?

- Small screening events (churches, clubs, etc.)
- Couldn't find anybody for a requested screening at a health fair in Mesquite (though short notice, was embarrassing)
- Some hospitals have policies against outside "screening
- Urology association or hospital identifies physicians/nurses for possible screening day
- Request will be honored if a minimum number of men are signed up before the fair
- Screening times will be adjusted to number of men signed up

 (may consult advisors, expect advisors to ask me to add/remove if necessary)

- PC Fundraisers by associated organizations
- Selected Regional or National Fundraisers (ACS, Us TOO, ZERO, PC Foundation)



Website – Co Denial of Posting Request - proposed

Special Events

- Health Fair events whose main purpose is the sale of specific products or events where patients sign up for a specific physician
- Fund-raising requests
 - Fundraisers for local out-of-state organizations with no direct benefit to local survivors
- Advertisement-like material for hospitals, physicians or physicians' associations
- Discussion
- Vote



Sponsors Expect

- Website ✓
- 501(c)(3)
- Functional organization (awareness, screening data, etc.)

• 501(c)(3) requirements

- an organization with members and a leadership
- a documentation (by-laws) on the organization
- conflict of interest disclaimer
- 28 page application that may require additional documents
- statement of income and expenses
- \$300 application fee if our projected income is less than \$5,000 (otherwise \$750)
- funding for application fee; we should be able to get free legal help from survivors


