What is Prostate Cancer?



The prostate is part of the male reproductive system, located below the bladder and just in front of the rectum. It is a walnut-size gland that manufactures fluid for semen.

Prostate cancer is a disease that affects the cells in the prostate. If cells divide in an abnormal way, they can form a tumor. Cancerous prostate tumors can block the flow of urine and, left untreated, can spread to other parts of the body.

Prostate cancer is the most common invasive cancer in men. Every year over 230,000 men are diagnosed with the disease in the United States, and about 30,000 will die. In Texas alone, over 13,500 men are diagnosed every year. If detected early, prostate cancer is often curable.

The majority of newly diagnosed prostate cancers are localized. (In other words, the tumor growth has not spread beyond the prostate gland). This is good news; early detection allows treatment options that increase chances of survival.

Prostate Cancer, in its early stages, may cause no symptoms. Once prostate cancer is detected, a number of treatment options may be recommended. Prostate Cancer Kills One Man Every 17 Minutes Don't Be One of Them

For the general population, a man in his lifetime has about a

- 16 percent chance (1 in 6) of being diagnosed with prostate cancer. The risk of being diagnosed increases to 20 percent for African-American men.
- 3 percent chance (1 in 33) of dying from prostate cancer.

The older you are, the greater the risk of getting prostate cancer. See the chart below:




NTxPCC History

New guidelines by the American Urology Association (AUA) recommend prostate cancer screening for men aged 40 or older, stating that an above average PSA score at age 40 is a strong predictor of developing the disease later in life.

In addition, AUA recommends that men who wish to be screened have a digital rectal exam as well as PSA testing.

Risk factors for Prostate Cancer are AGE FAMILY HISTORY and RACE



Screening Support - Example



When helping at a screening event: (Car Show, FW)

Make sure men know what they are waiting in line for...

Explain there will be both a lab test and DRE – it is important to do both (assure them it's not too bad) and if they say they want to only test PSA – explain it's our policy to do both. If they don't want to do both, than they need to excuse themselves from the screening.

Ask the men if they are having any urinary problems (burning, pain, that type of thing.)

Screenings are for men with NO symptoms (BPH symptoms are okay).

Ask when they had their last screening. If it was anytime within this year (last 9 months) than ask them to wait for next screening.

This is NOT the place to be checking on previous elevated PSA's or double check someone else's results.

Make sure the men have not already been treated for cancer. (We always get a few wanting a follow up PSA)

Make sure they are old enough! At least 40 – if they are younger and want to be screened, ask them to talk to nurses first to determine if at high risk and appropriate to be screened.

Health Fair Support - Example



Job Descriptions for Survivors at Health Fairs (TH Harris Methodist - Modified)

Be friendly and engage men of screening age in conversation.

Ask men if they have been screened for prostate cancer in the last year.

It is okay to tell them that you are a survivor and encourage them to get tested.

Distribute pamphlets – but don't force them. If someone really doesn't want it – they'll just throw it away at the next trash can.

Answer questions the men have about how they do testing, what's it like, that type of thing.

Do not go into details about your personal experience with biopsy, or other specific medical details.

The emphasis here is to assure them it's not so bad and probably saved your life.

Refer specific medical type questions to the nurse with you at the event (if applicable).

Encourage men to get screened or see their Dr. – but do not push too hard....

There is still controversy about the benefit of PSA testing and its overall impact on prostate cancer survival. – OK to mention screening risks

Encourage women to take the information home to the "men in their lives" – it might be a husband, brother, father, son, uncle, boyfriend, etc...
